Mission Statement

The Indian Head Church of God exists to glorify God with Christ centered worship, Biblically oriented discipleship and Holy Spirit directed evangelism and mission.



We continue with the temporary changes because of Covid:

- * There are no Bibles or Hymnals in the pews. You are encouraged to bring your Bible. The words to the songs will be on the screens.
- * Every other row of the pews are roped off. There are ushers to help with the seating.
- * Hand sanitizer is available in the foyer and at the pews.
- * There is no greeting with the shaking of hands.
- * An offering box is placed in the back of the church, as the ushers will not be passing the plates for the offering.
- * There is no Wee Worshipers or Junior Church during the 11:00 worship service until further notice.
- * Children's Sunday School Intermediate Dept. began Oct. 11. The Primary class and Jr/Sr High class will begin at a later date that will be announced.
- * **Masks are to be worn.**
- * You may enter thru the double doors on either side of the church, and the back door under the canopy. We ask that you do not enter thru the side office door.
- * There are Bulletins available each week and you can pick one up from the podium as you enter the Sanctuary.

Our team is so blessed to have each of you encouraging us in many ways, which is just as

important as actually going on the trip west. There be many ways that you all will be able to support our team. So if you are wanting to help in some way, here are the upcoming opportunities. We would like to thank you for your interest in our trip and your willingness to support our efforts in the advancement of the kingdom of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We will be flying out of Pittsburgh on July 30th and will be having several fundraisers to help with the cost of our airline tickets and the cost involved in renting a vehicle once we get to Albuquerque, until we have use of the Gamerco church van.

From April 1st through April 30th, please order from Little Caesars! This will be an easy way to have a pizza dinner kit delivered right to your door. All the ordering will be done online and for each item you order, you will be helping a team member purchase an airline ticket. Each team member will have his/her own code so you can order from one member or from each of us. We hope you enjoy your pizza as it will be delivered right to your door.

On April 10th, you can make sure your pets are up- to- date with their rabies vaccinations by coming to our drive thru rabies clinic. For just \$12.00 a pet you will be able to stay in your vehicle and let one of our professionally licensed veterinarians (one of which is going on the trip, Dr. Mary Bowser), vaccinate your family pet(s). Not only will you be able to take care of your pets, but you can also buy some hoagies, baked goods, and a bottle of water or pop. This will not only benefit your family, but it is another way to support our team members by helping to cover our transportation costs.

Please put May 8th on your calendars as we will be hosting a team yard sale in the IHCOG parking lot. We will have Sparks Catering Truckin! Fresh Food Truck available from 8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.; both breakfast and lunch items will be available. So join us for a great day of shopping at our tables and dining with the food you purchase. For all of you yard sale lovers, please come and buy what we are selling. This is another way in which you can support our ministry to the Southwest.

The Indian Head Church of God's annual yard sale will be held on June 19th; we are happy to announce that this event is back for the community to enjoy! It is a great day of fellowship, and this year all the proceeds from the yard sale and bake sale will be going to help fund our team's transportation costs. Please come out and support our team. If you would like to donate a baked good for the bake sale, we would appreciate that, or you can rent a table and try to sell your own items. As always there will be plenty of food and items available for purchase. We are also hoping to have the community clothing boutique available for your shopping experience, keeping in mind social distancing and safety precautions. The money from the boutique will be used for local outreach that we do throughout the year.

Please come out to the IHCOG on June 19th for a wonderful day of fun and fellowship, all while supporting our mission trip to the Southwest this summer.

The administrative council at the IHCOG has given us their full support by giving our team the approval to ask the congregation for monetary donations which will be used to purchase food and necessary VBS supplies while at Gamerco. We will be providing meals for the Navajo adults and children who will be attending our VBS, as well as the staff that are helping. We are asking for your financial donations, and if you choose to contribute, please mark on your church envelope that you are giving towards the Mission Trip's food and VBS supplies. Please prayerfully consider donating money towards our VBS experience; this may be the first time some of the Navajos we come in contact with have ever heard about our best friend, Jesus. Please keep an eye out for the meal tracker which will be on display on the bulletin board in the foyer. We will be updating everyone on the progress we are making as the donations come in. We are planning to provide food for 14 team members and 50 VBS participants including parents and children. The estimated cost for the meals for the team for breakfast and lunch and for the dinners prior to VBS

is \$1,000. Please consider helping us fill a plate and watch the display grow as we track the progress of your donations on the bulletin board.

Our team is looking forward to seeing how God is going to bless us through the generosity of all of you, our prayer and financial supporters! We would like to thank you in advance for being willing to pray for us, for providing the needed finances, and for being such an encouragement as we prepare to share the gospel to our friends in the Southwest from July 30th-August 7th, 2021.

"IT IS FINISHED"

As Jesus hung on the cross, the mission of redemption was accomplished. Jesus' mission was to do his Father's will for his Father's glory. That will included teaching and working miracles in order to proclaim the Kingdom of God was at hand. God's ordained will included Jesus becoming a substitutionary sacrifice, that is, taking the punishment for our sins; "for the wages of sin is death". {Romans 6:23}

Christ became the sacrificial lamb, carrying our sins, and gave up his life for us. On that cross of death, as Jesus breathed his last, he said, "It is finished."

The life had been lived. The mission was accomplished. The Perfect Sacrifice for our sins was finished!

BUT, that was not all God had planned. In fact, six times the Bible states, "God raised him from the dead." {Acts 2:24, 3:15, 10:40, 13:30, 34; Romans 10:9.} On that wonderful morning when much of that country was still in a dead sleep, God awakened His beloved Son from the sleep of death with His own declaration, "It is finished!"

The prophet Isaiah declared, "On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; he will swallow up death forever." {Isa. 25:7-8a} The apostle Paul phrased it this way, "'Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." {1 Cor. 15:55-57}

Jesus said "It is finished," as he completed the mission of redemption. God declared "It is finished," as his victorious plan of salvation and restoration defeated death and the grave. There is just one more to declare "It is finished," and it's you.

Many people have taken for granted the work of Christ in his death and resurrection. They have believed with their heads what scripture says but they have not embraced it by faith and allowed it to transform their lives. The Bible says, "That if you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame." {Romans 10:9-11}

May you be among the people who say, "Surely this is our God; we trusted in him, and he saved us. This is the LORD, we trusted in him; let us rejoice and be glad in his salvation. {Isaiah 25:9}

The Easter message is the declaration, "It is finished!"
