


October is Pastor Appreciation Month.

*The annual Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, Nov. 14 at 9:45 a.m. in the Sanctuary during the Sunday School hour.

*We are continuing to support the Back Pack Buddies Program.

*Outreach & Missions: Will be donating \$100 to Springfield CNPritts school to sponsor t-shirts for the children. They are also donating \$500 towards pastoral support in India, and \$1,000 towards unsponsored children in Bangladesh.

They will be blessing teachers at Springfield CNPritts, and the Champion Christian Schools with Kleenex and hand wipes.

Showing the Colors

The season we have just entered, in my opinion, is the most beautiful season of all. The colors of the trees and bushes are oft times breath taking. Red and yellow apples being picked from trees alongside a field of orange pumpkins with tan colored vines, what a sight as nature shows its colors.

"Showing the Colors" is a way of being identified. Today inner city gangs "show the colors" by the clothing they wear and the way they wear them. It may be a particular sports team, the way of wearing a ball cap. Some years ago I encountered some youth at a church camp who wore a bandanna around their right leg, just above the knee, as a sign of belonging to "the group".

The most understood showing of the colors is when the American flag is presented before an event or in a parade. In the old movie westerns when the cavalry would come riding in the officer in charge would often give the command to the flag barrier to "show the colors". At that time the Stars and Stripes and perhaps the company's insignia flag would be unfurled. In war, it was "the colors" which led the way into battle and it was "the colors" which were surrendered upon defeat. And it was the white flag with its lack of colors which was used as a sign of truce, peace, or surrender.

In all these situations it is the colors which gained the attention and became its identifying mark. As followers of Jesus Christ, we too have a way of showing our colors. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount" said.



"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven."
