# Christmas Peace

The cup of tea is steeping as she settles into her soft chair setting in the sun. These moments have been longed for all day. The earlier hours had been chaotic - pack lunches - get the kids to school - make phone calls for appointments - clean up the kitchen - plan dinner. Now she finally has some peace.
