Why I Observe Lent

Just a closer walk with Thee, Grant it, Jesus, is my plea, Daily walking close to Thee, Let it be. dear Lord. let it be.

I never understood what Lent was until I was in seminary; although I heard people say "I gave up for Lent" (fill in the blank, usually with chocolate). I guess I knew it was vaguely Catholic (which was completely foreign to me), but I never heard of anyone in the Churches of God observing it. But then I read Worship is a Verb, by Robert Webber, and my understanding of – and appreciation for – church history and worship expanded. The word "Lent" comes from the Latin word for "lengthen," probably referring to the lengthening days of spring, and it lasts forty days because of Moses' forty days on Mt. Sinai and Jesus' forty days of fasting and being tempted in the wilderness.

A distinctly Christian practice, Lent was developed by the early Church to be a season when Christians would spend time in prayer and fasting in support of those preparing to be baptized on Easter Sunday. Because converts went through a very specific time of "exorcism" prior to baptism, mature Christians would share in their fasting and spiritual discipline. It evolved into a forty day period of time when Christians would "walk" with Jesus to Calvary and the Cross every year, thus enriching and renewing their sense of self-denial and "carrying the cross" (cf. Matt. 16:24; Mark 8:34; Luke 9:23) so that the joy of the Resurrection would replace the fasting with feasting. As I've learned about the background of Lent and some of the *good* reasons for it, I've begun to look forward to it every year. Here are some reasons why:

- 1. Lent reminds me how Jesus "set His face toward Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51), and how His disciples must also be willing to walk a hard road in their relationship with Him. We must not expect an easy path (cf. Matt. 7:13,14). The spiritual discipline of fasting forces us to say "NO" to ourselves and develop a closer walk with Jesus.
- 2. Lent allows us to join with other believers in corporate preparation for Holy Week. Christians and churches that do not observe the church year deprive themselves of a valuable resource. True, most churches observe Palm Sunday, Good Friday and especially Easter, but if we observe the season of Lent beforehand we will have a deeper appreciation for the meaning of those events.
- 3. Lent is a kind of spiritual "spring cleaning," when we take stock of our lives and invite the Lord to identify those things in us that displease Him. Because bad habits are so hard to break, and good habits are hard to form, Lent provides the *time* for the Lord to work on us. A pastor friend of mine said: "Repentance is not 'once for all' but a lifelong part of experiencing forgiveness. It's important to remind ourselves of that, especially as it relates to Christ's passion."

So what does observing Lent involve? Do we just pick out a food at random and give it up? Is that all it is? Unfortunately that's what some people think, and for that reason Lent has lost its close connection to spiritual discipline and the closer walk with Jesus. Worse, Lent for some is a legalistic form of godliness based on self-deprivation, which Scripture warns us against (cf. Matt. 6:16-18; Col. 2:20-23). We need to beware of that, and Lent must never cause spiritual pride. No, a better way is to see fasting (either from a food or an activity) as only one aspect of Lent, an expression of a concerted desire to have a closer walk with Jesus. In addition to fasting, perhaps we might observe Lent by simplifying our life and having more time for family prayer or volunteering at a ministry. Or we might attend special Lenten services in the community. Whatever you do for Lent, always remember that it's not just about fasting or losing weight – a closer walk with Jesus is the main goal. Let us follow Him to Calvary and to the now-empty Tomb.



BE THE DONKEY



Corrie ten Boom, a devout Christian who helped shelter hundreds of Jewish people from Nazis during World War II, was asked how she stayed humble despite her fame.

"When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday on the back of a donkey, and everyone was waving palm branches and throwing garments onto the road and singing praises, do you think that for one moment it ever entered the head of that donkey that any of that was for him?" she replied. "If I can be the donkey on which Jesus Christ rides in his glory, I give him all the praise and all the honor."

Jesus told his followers they'd need to carry (or "take up") their cross. But how well do you carry your Savior? How do you bring him into a world that desperately needs the good news of the gospel?
