

LIFE IS FOR THE BIRDS

The hummingbird feeder is ready to be hung up outside. The fast little creatures will be here any day now. Also, the Oriole feeder is full of grape jelly to welcome those orange and black harbingers of warmer weather. These birds, and two dozen other kinds of birds in our yard throughout the year, feast on the seeds and nectar provided for them.

Last week I was watching a bird feeder with its frequent visitors and remembered what Jesus said: *"Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?"* {Matthew 6:26} He was teaching his followers. Their days were filled with difficulties and uncertainties. A day's work didn't always result in a day's living - that is, wages enough to meet needs. Jesus told them, *"Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?"* {Matthew 6:27}

We live in some uncertain times. War is knocking on multiple doorways of our world. The economy is being impacted by trade disruptions, government regulations, and local, regional, and international unrest. Add to that, we are in a presidential election cycle which has heightened insecurities. Yet, the truth is we have always lived in uncertain times.

How can I say this? Because God - who blesses my backyard with his beautiful creation of colorful birds, who enables me to notice them and provide seed for them, who takes care of them with food especially when I fail to - so greatly and deeply loves you, he finds you most valuable AND will provide for you too! Jesus said, *"My purpose is to give life in all its fullness."* {John 10:10}


