Not Traditions & Worldly Principles -by Pastor Douglas Nolt

Have you noticed how unreasonable society is today when it comes to so many things, and especially spiritual things? Captain Scott O'Grady, a pilot shot down over Bosnia, gave credit to "my love for God and His love for me" for his rescue. While appearing on a news talk show, O'Grady said he prayed almost the entire time. The interviewer asked him if he blamed God for being shot down, and he emphatically said 'no'.

So many people see God as the Santa Claus of heaven. If you have faith in him everything will go perfect - and if it doesn't then "Santa Claus" didn't deliver on his end of the bargain and is to blame. Does that make sense? No!

The topic of conversation on the radio one day was, "Why is religion necessary?" There were a variety of calls and responses... many of them Christian in scope. But one of the responses was that all religions of the world are working toward the same thing - so all of them ought to get along with each other.

While many think that this sounds good, why is it then that the Christians are the ones called to give up their unique practices and beliefs? Or they are many times expected to wash down their theology to make Jesus Christ not <u>THE WAY</u> to God but instead <u>A Way</u>. Does that make sense? No!

This very same issue which we face today when dealing with the concern of religious faith in our society, the Apostle Paul faced in his day too. For many, today is an era for a new age of religion in our world. But a closer look at Paul's letter to the Colossians shows us that it is the same old story!

"See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the basic principles of this world rather than on Christ." (Colossians 2:8)

How do we know if its hollow and deceptive? It will depend on human tradition which is the rules and regulations (dos and don'ts) of a group or society. And it will depend on the basic principles of the world which actually places more emphasis on the endearment of those things which are "created" than the worship of the Creator.

So upon what are our philosophy, our traditions, our practices and our principles as Christians to be based? On Christ!

Our salvation comes not from the things of creation. It does not come by what you do or don't do - the holiday's you observe, the sacrifices you make. You have been set free from all of the ways of the world - most prominent of them is sin. And Christ has set you free when you believed, and confessed him as your Lord and Savior.

Jesus said, "So, if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." (John 8:36).


