Several weeks ago our son Ben and I watched a movie together. The movie was entitled, *Uncharted*. It's based upon a video game. In the same genre as National Treasure, the main theme is explorer seeking ancient lost treasure.

The main character's name is Nate. He and his brother were orphans. They had lived in an orphanage and when the older brother Sam times out in the system he goes off on his own exploring the world. The only communication Nate has from Sam in the years that follow are postcards sent to him on an irregular basis telling about Sam's ventures in one or two sentence snippets. Years later, Nate is finally out of the orphanage himself still holding on to those postcards from his brother. I'll spare you all the details about the movie.

It was one of those postcards which Sam had sent to Nate which is the real focus for me today. That postcard contained a simple one sentence statement, "What is lost can be found."

"What is lost can be found." That is a powerful statement for the follower of Christ. John Newton captured it well in "Amazing Grace," "I once was lost but now am found." For the Christian being lost states our condition before God. Being found states our condition being restored to relationship with God through Jesus. I was given pause to consider yet another element and that is the difference between lost and hiding.

In the Gospel of Luke 15, we read three parables which Jesus taught. A parable of a lost sheep and the Good Shepherd goes and finds him. A parable of a lost coin and the woman diligently searches in her home and finds it. And then there is The Prodigal Son, no doubt lost, but that son left and hid himself in the ways of the world which were not the ways of his father. The father did not go seeking the son but he earnestly watched for him to return. And all three of those parables end with the celebration for what was lost has been found.

Those hiding may not want to be found, but that should not stop us from earnestly watching, preparing for the emergence, or seeking with hope for signs of those returning from isolation. These will happen in varied sequences and timing which can't be planned - but must be prepared for.

The father welcomed the returning son by running to him, embracing him with love, adorning him with honor, and holding a feast with "the fattened calf" - which was ready, awaiting the celebration. The father did not know 'when' but he was ready to welcome him back whenever.

As Christ Followers, we should take our lead from the father - to be ready whenever for whomever will be returning. Can you do that? Will we do that? How we respond to those who emerge and return will be a reflection of the hope all of us should have in Christ.

Jesus said that there will be a celebration when what was lost is found, and what is hidden returns. That my friends is the hope in which we must live and be in our day: always ready to celebrate with those returning. Remember, "What is lost can be found!"
