Signs are important! Without them we would only guess at what may happen in the future (or even the present). Without signs we wouldn't even know the weather.


On one occasion, Jesus was talking to the religious leaders of his day when they asked for a sign - a sign to show them Jesus was indeed the special one sent from God.


"He replied, "When evening comes, you say, 'It will be fair weather, for the sky is red,' and in the morning, 'Today it will be stormy, for

the sky is red and overcast.' You know how to interpret the appearance of the sky, but you cannot interpret the signs of the times." - Matthew 16:2-3

What Jesus was telling them was that they could tell day to day things, like the weather, by seeing (with eyes) the signs exhibited but they were not observing (with eyes and heart) "the signs of the times".

This is a good warning for us too. We should not be so caught up in the "signs of the day" that we miss the true, important "signs of the times." In our preparations for a big meal and family gathering at Thanksgiving, let us not forget to whom our thanks should truly go - God, our Heavenly Father. It is He who graciously provides our bounty. In the excitement and anticipation of Christmas, with carols and parties and gifts, let us not ignore the true sign of the season which God has given to us, His son Jesus Christ. It is Jesus who came to be a "sign" of God's love for you and me.

Church Snow Policy

There will be Sunday morning services unless there is no electricity and or heat at the church. However, the church advises the use of caution and care when coming to church during times of winter weather.

The Saturday Evening Worship Service will automatically be cancelled if there is an NWS issued ACTIVE WEATHER ALERT involving the hours of 6:00-9:00 p.m. Active weather alerts would include such common items as a:

- Winter Weather Advisory
- Winter Storm Warning
- Ice Storm Warning

Veterans Day has its roots in what was called Armistice Day, the day when a peace agreement was signed with Germany ending World War I. Armistice Day was established with a proclamation by President Woodrow Wilson which reads in part: "Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations." On June 1, 1954, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day to honor all U.S. veterans.

On Veterans Day, let us remember and honor those men and women who gave of themselves, and let us continue to pray for our men and women currently serving in the military.
