### LIFE'S SPRINGTIME GIVES LIFE

The Springtime is a wonderful reminder of the refreshment and resilience of life. While we have not had much of a Winter with unbearable cold, snow and ice, never the less we do look forward to Spring. It will be so wonderful to see the signs of hope as the trees and plants burst forth with life again!
