My Dear Friends:

Triskaidekaphobia is the fear or avoidance of the number 13. It is said that some buildings have had their floors renumbered to avoid the "13th Floor." And the idea of not seating 13 guests at a table can be traced to a superstition based on the account of Jesus eating the Last Supper with his twelve disciples. Complicating the number further is paraskevidekatriaphobia, the fear of Friday the 13th.

Fifty years ago, in 1973, the 13th of April fell on a Friday. It is a day I will remember forever, not because of bad luck or misfortune, but because of a surrender and an acceptance I made that night.

Growing up in a Christian family, going to church, and Sunday School every week did not negate my own need to trust Christ to become my Savior and forgive my sins. I was nine years old when I did that in February 1967. The following month I was baptized. Through the years, God was working in my life drawing me closer to Him, and even though the human nature of a teenager struggled for its own way, God didn't retreat. I was actively involved in CGYA, Youth Choir, and Church camp.

It was in my sophomore year of high school when I became acutely aware that God wanted to do more in my life. Church camp the August before had begun that revelation for me. It was January 1973, when the voice of God began to speak into my heart - calling me to a deeper relationship and to serve Him as a pastor in His Church. I wrestled with understanding what it all meant. Though desiring to talk about it with someone more spiritually mature, I held it to myself.

For three months I heard the Spirit patiently calling while I opened more and more of myself to God. During a week of revival services at our church Friday evening's service was a special Youth Night. I can't tell you what exactly was on the program that night. As a matter of fact, I can't even tell you who the preacher was that week. But it all came together at the altar during the closing of the service when I made my surrender of my life and accepted God's calling upon my life. Friday the 13th of April 1973!

There are many more details I could share about that night and the days immediately following but there is none more precious to me than this one: on that same night, right around the corner from me at that prayer rail was my little sister Kim trusting Jesus to be her Savior too. Kim is in Heaven now with our Heavenly Father.

I can say I have not looked back with regret once at the calling of God upon my life on Friday the 13th of April 1973. Rather, as the Apostle Paul stated, "I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me." (Philippians 3:12 NIV)

For some, the number 13 is to be avoided, and Friday the 13th at all costs. But for myself, Friday the 13th of any month, and the "unlucky" number 13 in general, are constant reminders of God's calling upon my life.
