
FREE HOMEMADE SOUP

The 2023 camp dates for Camp Sonrise Mountain this summer are as follows:


*Week 1 (entering grades 10, 11, 12) June 11-17


















Community Yard and Bake Sale

YOUR STORY

It was 1974. Other than a few kids I knew from high school, I was with a group of strangers - yet they were friends - brothers and sisters in Christ. We were a part of a ministry team which had gone to a church an hour drive from my home. Throughout the weekend each of the team members were called upon to share a testimony of what God had done for them or was doing within them. There were the stories of how God had delivered one from alcoholism, and another from drugs. One person told the story of a shattered family that was restored. Still another shared how God had delivered them from a life which was spiraling down, deeper into crime.

All weekend I listened to these testimonies. I praised God for how wonderfully He had moved in the lives of these people - but wondered about His working within my own life. I wasn't a runaway teen from a broken home. I had good, Christian parents and sisters who loved the Lord too. I wasn't into alcohol or drugs, not even tobacco. Compared to some of the testimonies I was hearing I led a very bland life.

Finally, Sunday morning came and I had not been called upon to give my testimony. Then it happened - during the second worship service with almost 1,000 people in the congregation the team leader called me forward to share my testimony. Me. The somewhat ordinary guy with the bland life and not so extraordinary testimony (other than responding to God's call into the ministry) was asked to share in front of the largest gathering of the weekend.

What made me think about this experience? One time I was talking with a fellow church member. I asked them about their story, their testimony, and they shared with me how they had realized they needed a change in their life. They recognized the "God-size" hole within and sought Him and found Him. To me, hearing that story from one who might be described as ordinary, was truly extraordinary because it was THEIR STORY.

What I realized back in 1974, I am reminded of again today, and I share with you. Each one of us has a story, a testimony, about our encounter and relationship with God. And each person's testimony will touch some others, stirring the embers of faith and rekindling the God -created yearning for God.

People need to hear your God story. We each should tell our story. When was the last time you shared your story about God and you?

The Apostle Paul told Timothy: "For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. So do not be ashamed to testify about our Lord."

(2 Timothy 1:7-8a)
