## MORE OF MY STORY

It was Mark's 81<sup>st</sup> birthday. He traveled with his son and daughter-in-law to Chambersburg for a very special program that evening. Towards the end of the worship service nine men robed in black were invited forward to stand in front of the crowd of hundreds. Standing toward the middle of that group were two of Mark's relatives - a great nephew, the grandson of his late brother, and Mark's own grandson.

The candidates were challenged with and responded to questions regarding faithfulness to Christ, His Word, and the Church of God. After which each man, individually, recited these vows of Dedication:

I promise to be zealous and faithful in maintaining the truth of the Gospel and peace of the church against whatever persecution or opposition may arise; to be faithful and diligent in the exercise of all private and personal duties which become a Christian and a minister of the Gospel; I will endeavor to adorn the profession of the Gospel ministry with Holy consecration, and to walk with exemplary piety before the flock over which God shall make me an overseer; I will "study to show myself approved unto God, a workman unashamed, rightly dividing the Word of Truth" and to cooperate with the Annual Conference, and the General Conference in carrying out the work of the church.

Following the making of these vows, the nine ordinands knelt as the conference officials and ministry commission members laid their hands upon these men and prayed the prayer of consecration upon them.

The day was June 22, 1983. Mark Nolt, my grandfather, was present for my ordination into the ministry. It is hard to believe that 40 years have passed since that solemn occasion. From a calling into ministry 50 years ago, to ordination 10 years later, all the way to today - the Lord has continued to prepare and use me for what He began in me a very long time ago when I first trusted Jesus as my Savior.

In his commission to Timothy, the Apostle Paul wrote: 2 Timothy 2:1-2, 15 *Timothy, my dear son, be strong with the special favor God gives you in Christ Jesus. You have heard me teach many things that have been confirmed by many reliable witnesses. Teach these great truths to trustworthy people who are able to pass them on to others. .. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.* 

I am thankful for all those who have invested 'the great truths' in me over the years, and are doing so still today. And I am grateful for the opportunities 'pass them on to others.'
