## AN UANSWERED QUESTION

At ball parks, at community gatherings, at Independence Day celebrations all around this nation, a song will be sung with great adulation. Most will stand automatically or by invitation at the opening chords of the melody. Some may remain seated or kneel in disparagement for the failings they feel it represents. But no matter the reaction to the moment of its singing, the song asks a question which deserves a response.

We only sing one stanza of our National Anthem which raises the question of our nation's flag and of freedom. There however are four verses to that poem. The next two stanzas tell more history in an attempt to answer the question.
