Thank you for joining in the journey this Summer with the *Walk in Wisdom*. It began with an invitation to read one chapter of the Book of Proverbs each day in the month of July. We were so excited to see a great number of you with hands raised accepting the challenge. Some of you so took hold of this journey that you ran ahead of the rest of us, reading more than one chapter a day. A few of you, once you completed one time through began a second, and even a third time through this book of wisdom. You are an inspiration!

Then, as we neared the end of July, we extended the invitation to do it again in August: 31 days - 31 chapters. With smiles, some nodded their heads, others raised their hands, and the journey continues. And so has the inspiration! One person told me they would read through Proverbs every month for the next year - along with their other daily Bible reading and devotions. Wow!

Some of you may not have thought you could read through a book of the Bible and you discovered this journey was a great experience. Some of you learned you can read God's Word and understand it in so simple and practical ways. And we all have learned that: 1) Wisdom is based on God and on truth; 2) Wisdom is the right application of knowledge; and 3) Without Christ the proverbs become only pithy sayings.

The intention for reading the Proverbs was in order to get you into God's Word so that God's Word will get into you so Christ can be lived out through you. A Walk in Wisdom really is to be a walk with God.

An ancient saying notes: 'The journey of a thousand miles begins with one step.' And you have taken that step and added many more, making it into a journey. The Walk in Wisdom is a Walk with God. It is not a one time event but a lifetime adventure.

So, I pray that as you continue to Walk in Wisdom that the joy of Jesus will wash over you, refreshing you every step of the way. Further, I pray that the testimony of Noah's life might also be applied to you as it is written: "Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he *walked with God*." {Genesis 6:9}
