



Coffee in the Bible?

Did you know that -- according to the Bible -- only men should be making coffee? You can find that in the book "He-Brews." (I can almost hear the groans ... I'm not sure if the joke works better in print or spoken.) No, the Book of Hebrews says nothing about the making of my favorite beverage, but it DOES say quite a bit about the Christian faith! So I'm happy to introduce it as our next sermon series throughout October and November.

Here are some basic facts about this fascinating book that will help you gain a deeper understanding as we begin our journey together. First, who wrote it? This is a bit of a mystery, as the author doesn't identify him/herself. Early tradition considered St. Paul to be the author, but very early on historians (namely, Eusebius in the 4th century) began questioning this, because the style of writing and choice of words in Hebrews is quite different from the other books written by St. Paul. There are a host of other possible authors, ranging from Apollos to Priscilla to one of the other apostles (e.g. Barnabas). Whoever it was, he or she had to be fairly well-educated in Greek, and very familiar with Jewish culture and religious practice.

Who was Hebrews written to? Although it doesn't begin with a typical greeting (such as St. Paul's frequent "Grace and peace to you"), it does conclude with parting words and blessings. We know the intended recipients are certainly Jewish Christians because of the sharp focus on Jesus' priestly role and the Temple sacrifices, as well as the frequent warnings to NOT fall away from Him back into Judaism.

This brings us to the main themes. As we read this important book, we'll see how the author spends a great deal of time discussing the identity and role of Jesus the Messiah, and how we as His disciples are to follow Him faithfully. We'll also see frequent use of the phrase "Let us therefore ... " — encouragements based on trust in Jesus. (Make sure to pay close attention to these as you read Hebrews!)

Just as we did with Proverbs and Ecclesiastes this summer, we want to invite and challenge you to read through Hebrews over the next few months. There are only 13 chapters, but they're fairly dense, so feel free to break up your reading using the following chart. As always, be sure to pray and ask the Lord to reveal His message to you before reading, and take note of any verse or phrase that "jumps off the page" at you — that's a good indication of what God wants you to see in particular. Let us read prayerfully and obediently! (Feel free to repeat for the next month.) Please see the reading schedule on the back side of this page.
