



If you are packing your own shoebox, please bring it to the church by Sunday, November 17.




# Join us for our Shoebox Packing Parties!

# From the Pastor



### "To Protect and to Serve"

"To protect and to serve" is the motto of many police departments in our nation. Thousands of police officers have lived by, and some have died holding to, this motto.

A retired NYPD officer, who is running for Congress, a week ago cited her father, also retired from the NYPD, for their personal motto they lived out while in uniform: "To protect those who cannot protect themselves."

This gave me cause to think about the millions of men and women who have served in the military, offering themselves as the first line of protection for the American people. They have "stood on the wall" keeping vigilant watch to protect us and to serve the cause of freedom.
