*We are going to Woodcrest Senior Living, in Scottdale, to do Christmas Caroling on Sunday, Dec. 8 at 3 p.m.

*Four new lockboxes are in use in the church. Two are used for weekly offerings. One is currently in use for Turkey Vouchers. One is being used for CSM Envelope Fundraiser money.
