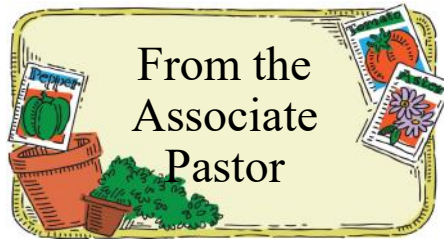

Vision for the Harvest

Every spring, thousands of gardeners go out to plant a variety of vegetables and flowers. Whether it's a large garden or just a few pots, the gardener has a vision for the harvest he or she expects. They know it will take a lot of work and even some anxiety, whether due to weather or insects or critters that like to eat the plants. (Last year I had the misfortune of dealing with deer who developed a taste for green tomatoes.) Even though we experience failure, we keep trying and we keep hoping.

The Church does this, too. God gives us a vision for the harvest and sends us out to work in His field. St. Paul writes this in 1 Cor. 3:6-9 – *“I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labor. For we are co-workers in God’s service; you are God’s field, God’s building.”*

It's important to remember that God is the only One who can bring to life the seeds we plant. But we have the very important role of being “co-workers” with God! More specifically, He works *through* us as we serve Him in the church and community.

We pour time and effort into a variety of ministries such as the Community Yard Sale, Vacation Bible School, and the Back-to-School Carnival. We pray for success, not just the number of participants, but – more importantly – the evidence of connection to Jesus and the Church.

So keep your vision for God's harvest alive! In all the challenges we'll face, let's remember that God is at work, and that it's HIS field. It's hard to know what the harvest will look like when you're planting seeds, but we know there won't BE a harvest if we don't.
