




INTERCESSOR PRAYER LIST

Invitation to Worship: Psalm 23
Scripture Reading: John 9:1-41
Message by Pastor Ben Tobias


"Blind No More"
John 9:1-41

What does it mean to be blind? Obviously it's the loss of the ability to see, one of our most important senses. In this story of Jesus healing a blind man, we learn that *spiritual* blindness is far worse than physical blindness, and that Jesus can transform a victim into a victor.

1. A theological debate (vv. 1-12)
 - a. What's the idea behind the disciples' question in v. 2?
 - b. How does Jesus answer, and what does He focus on in the face of a tragic situation?
 - c. Jesus says He is the "light of the world." How does He demonstrate it in the next verses?
2. The interrogation (vv. 13-34)
 - a. Describe the Pharisees' reaction. What bothered them about this healing? How do they treat the formerly blind man?
 - b. Describe the healed man's transformation from victim to witness. What stands out to you?
3. The conclusion (vv. 35-41)
 - a. When Jesus finds the healed man, He asks a question. How is this the fundamental question for all of us?
 - b. What is the final step in the healed man's journey?
 - c. How does Jesus describe spiritual blindness?

Take it home:

- Consider a difficult or tragic situation you or someone else is dealing with. How is God at work?
- Where are you on your journey: victim, witness, or worshiper?
